



**Dr. Adrian K. Haugabrook**

Dr. Adrian K. Haugabrook is Chair of the Board of Directors of the National AfterSchool Association based in Washington, DC. NAA, with a membership of over 9,000, is the leading voice of the afterschool profession dedicated to the development, education, and care of children and youth during their out-of-school hours. Dr. Haugabrook is also Vice President for Enrollment Management and Student Success and Chief Diversity Officer at Wheelock College in Boston, MA. He also served as the College's first Executive Director of the Aspire Institute- a policy, practice and research center promoting the success of children, families and communities.

Prior to joining Wheelock, Dr. Haugabrook served as Officer and Vice President for Local College Access Programs at TERI (The Education Resources Institute) and as Executive Director of Public Policy and Alliances at nationally recognized, Citizen Schools. While at TERI, he led a strategic initiative to expand programs and services to increase college-going rates in the Greater Boston area. At the state and national levels, Dr. Haugabrook was involved in media campaigns and policy initiatives aimed at increasing awareness and funding for college access and success initiatives. At Citizen Schools, he led an effort that took the Boston-based organization national into six states as well as a legislative effort that resulted in public supported statewide afterschool funding in MA. He held several administrative posts at higher education institutions in Georgia and Massachusetts. He has been published and is frequently called upon to advise and speak on issues pertaining to education policy at local, state and federal levels.

In addition to NAA, Dr. Haugabrook serves or has served on several Boards including New England Regional Council of the College Board, MetroWest Community Health Care Foundation (Founding Trustee), MetroWest YMCA (past-Chair), Wayside Youth and Family Support Services, Mitchell College, Wheelock College, Council on Education for Public Health, Greater Boston Kappa Charities Foundation and Diaconate Board at Myrtle Baptist Church. He served on Massachusetts Governor Deval Patrick's Education Readiness Project. He has received numerous honors and awards including a Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Senate Official Citation.

Dr. Haugabrook holds a bachelors degree from the University of West Georgia; masters from Georgia Southwestern State University, and doctoral degree in education from the University of Massachusetts Boston. He is married and has two young children.
